- o Guest Speaker: Ted Schiele
 - o Tobacco-free Tompkins County
 - o Pushing for Ithaca College becoming a smoke-free campus
 - Parent pressure aided in smoke-free residence halls
 - Law passed that all dormitories must be smoke-free
 - o Prof. in health communications here working with Ted Shiele
 - o 2015 tobacco use survey
 - 2016 smoke-free campus bill passed on SGC, to be brought in front of faculty and President's council, but did not get to these councils.
 - o A similar initiative is in progress at Cornell
 - o City of Ithaca has a comprehensive smoke-free policy

 - o Has a google folder already set up that has data sets for tobacco-free IC
 - Walking through second-hand smoke is unpleasant
 - Many schools have already gone tobacco-free

- Question from Noah: what's the punishment for students who do go against a smoke-free policy?
 - Answer: same as going against comparable school policies. When Cornell had a similar initiative, a committee was going to be set up to create an enforcement policy. The previous IC bill states, this policy is driven by respect for others and the environment and relies on the cooperate of tobacco users and non-tobacco users to be successful. It is the responsibility of all members to ensure the policy (paraphrased).
 - Maybe there are ambassadors trained in how to approach people
 - Need signage to ensure clear policies
- Question from Grace: do you have data from students regarding student desire for this?
 - Answer: student did survey in 2015 or 2016. Survey of the Cornell community in fall of 2019 revealed that campus may not be that different, but numbers could be a starting point. The Cornell survey revealed students clearly in favor of the policy, but not by an overwhelming amount.
 - 80% of IC students and 50% of staff report being exposed to second-hand smoke on campus
 - Smoke-free policy benefits individuals, health insurance policy, individuals' families, etc.
- Ouestion from Vincent: Many campuses have different policies regarding smoking-permitted areas, smoking in cars, etc. What's the ideal resolution?
 - Answer: Ideal is no smoking anywhere on campus including in vehicles.
 - Comes with the risk of having people walk away from their positions because they can't smoke on campus (this risk is increased on the Ithaca College campus since it's pretty far away from anything, which would mean designated smoking areas.)
 - Could still be called "smoke-free campus with designated smoking areas"
 - Accessibility issue for people who can't access pathways that may have second-hand smoke. Ideally designated smoking areas would be away from campus activity, high transit pathways, etc.
